Reading Card 1

Street Wise Safety

1. Look all ways before crossing the street. Then, walk (don't run) across.
2. Try to cross the street at a crosswalk, or at a corner. Even when you do use a crosswalk, or intersection, make sure the cars have seen you and have stopped, before you cross.
3. Watch for cars.
4. Obey the police and traffic signs.
5. Walk on the sidewalk, not on the road.
6. If there is no sidewalk, walk on the shoulder and face traffic.
7. Don't play on the road.
8. Pay attention to where you are going and the things around you. Be prepared to stop if the cars don't.







Reading Card 2

School Bus Safety

1. Wait for the bus on the sidewalk or shoulder.
2. Get on the bus in single file.
3. Hold the handrail while going up and down the steps.
4. Never push while getting on or off the bus.
5. Stay seated until it is time to get off the bus.
6. Never open the windows or doors. If the windows are open, don't put anything out the windows, especially body parts.



7. Never throw things out of the bus, or inside the bus.
8. Put books and other things on your lap, or under your seat.
Never put things in the aisles, including your feet.
9. If the bus has seatbelts, always put yours on.
10. Talk quietly. Do not yell or sing.
11. Obey the bus driver.
12. When crossing the street in front of the bus, walk in front of the bus.
Watch for cars before crossing.

Reading Card 3

Home Alone

1. If you are home alone, keep the doors and windows locked.
2. Ask your parent(s) to write a phone number where they can be reached and leave it near the phone. Also, keep the phone number of a neighbor or other adult in case your parent(s) can not be reached.
3. Never answer the door to **anyone** that you do not know. Do not let your friends in to play, unless your parent(s) have given you permission.
4. Do not tell anyone at the door or on the phone, that you are alone. Tell them your parent(s) are busy and ask for a message.
5. Do not use the stove.
6. Keep the phone number of the police near the phone in case of an emergency. Know your address in case you need to give it to the police. (Never tell your address to anyone else who calls you.)
