
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
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TO CANADA'S First Nations

- 1. Divide the class into groups of five or six. This will help with marking and allow more personal contact.
- 2. Encourage the students to brainstorm ideas about the theme and record them on chart paper.
- 3. Activities in this unit may be used as learning centres.
- 4. With the assistance of the teacher resource person, select music, films, videos, and computer materials that will support this unit.
- 5. The vocabulary list provided may be used for daily spelling and dictionary drill.
- 6. Invite a guest speaker familiar with the topic.
- 7. Have the students bring in newspaper and magazine articles that reflect the issues of Canada's First Nations. Discuss the articles with your class, look for feedback.
- 8. Have the students design and write books about native peoples. Have the books bound and placed in the school resource centre. This can also be encouraged as a small group activity.
- 9. Read stories written by authors about this topic.
- 10. Read poetry written by Canadian natives. Allow for class or group discussion.
- 11. Use the art activities to decorate the classroom.
- 12. Use the drama activities to entertain the class or other classes in the school.
- 13. Have the students keep track of their activities by using the tracking sheet provided.
- 14. Select the activities to meet the needs of the individual student. The activities are designed to meet the needs of the individual from easy to difficult.
