

Glossary

Ancestors: the people of a person's family who lived a long time ago

Bannock: a kind of biscuit rolled into a large, flat pancake

Breech-clout: A soft piece of hide that was pulled up between the legs and wrapped over a belt at the waist

Métis: A French word applied originally to people of French and Indian parentage

Nomads: people who move from place to place, generally to be near the food supply

Parfleche: a rawhide container used mainly for storage of pemmican and other food

Pemmican: food made of dried meat, grease and sometimes beries, pounded together

Pound: an enclosure for trapping or keeping animals

Quiver: a long hide bag for carrying arrows

Reserve: piece of land set aside for the sole use of a specific band of natives



Ritual: traditional pattern for performing a ceremony, particularly a religious one

Shaman: medicine man or woman with special powers who acts as a religious leader or healer

Sinew: a tough band of tissue that joins muscle to bone

Teepee (tipi): cone-shaped dwelling of the Plains Natives

Tribe: a group of people who share a common ancestry, language, culture and name
