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
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Wee Folk Trivia

- gnomes make blowpipes out of hollow stems of weeds?




- gnomes play bowling with rabbit droppings and soccer with a snowberry?

Boggart:

The boggart is the tiniest of the fairies. He is only half the size of a thumb. The boggarts were found in great Britain. They live in knotholes and no one ever sees them. The boggart loves to tease children and annoy adults. During the night he enjoys moving furniture about so that people trip when they get out of bed in the dark.

Brownie:

The brownie was found in Great Britain. A housewife who has a brownie in her cellar is very fortunate. The brownie will help do the housework and only wants a bowl of fresh milk left behind the door at bedtime. Brownies are little old men with short curly hair and wrinkled faces. They are dressed in brown suits. Brownies are mischievous and often play tricks on lazy or unkind people. People in Scotland who waste things are punished by the brownies.

Changeling:

Changelings are found throughout most of Europe. Fairies will exchange one of their own babies for a human baby. This fairy child is called a changeling. A human mother can usually tell if it is not her baby due to its odd behavior. If the human mother does something silly like trying to boil water in



eggshells, the changeling will laugh and begin to talk. The human mother knows he is too old to be a baby and she may go to put him in the oven or throw him in the fire. When this happens an old fairy woman will suddenly appear and exchange the real baby for the changeling.

Chin-Chin Kobakama:

In Japan a tiny fairy called Chin-Chin Kobakama looks after the beautiful thick mats which cover the floors of a Japanese house. If the children are careless the fairy will tease them to remind them about being careful. The name Chin-Chin Kobakama means "lovely little spirit wearing a skirt."

Cluricaun:

In Ireland is found the cluricaun. He looks like his Irish brother, the leprechaun. The cluricaun is a little old man dressed in old fashioned clothes. He is known for his hot fiery temper and mischievous tricks. Often he will attach himself to one family.

Drac:
