

Australia is the world's smallest **habitable** are thent. It is made up of the large island of Australia, and the smaller islands of Tomania and New Zealand. Even so, it is difficult to accurately describe its exact location was 2. It is because the eastern **coast** of New Zealand is more than 4 000 miles away from Australia's western coast! It is easier to describe Australia's relative location and places around it.

Many interesting features help us accribe Australia's relative location. Australia is in the southern hemisphere, south of the quator. Since Australia is an island, it is surrounded by water. The Pacific Countries to the east, and the Indian Ocean to the west and south. To the north are thir e smaller bodies of water called the Arafura Sea, the Gulf of Carpentaria, and the Toles Strait. To the northeast is a part of the Pacific Ocean known as the Calarsea. These bodies of water provide links between Australia and other parts of the lobe of in north and northwest are the islands of Indonesia and New Guinea, and in the south is Antarctica. To the east and northeast are many other smaller islands that make us an area known as Oceania.
