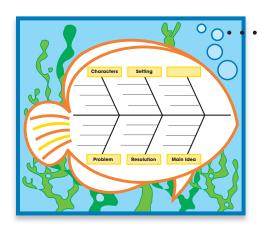




# **Graphic Organizer Transparencies**

To evaluate students' responses to any of the organizers, you may wish to the **Assessment Rubric** (on page 4).

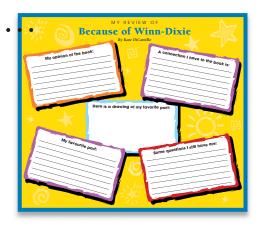


#### FISHBO E GREPHIC ORGANIZER

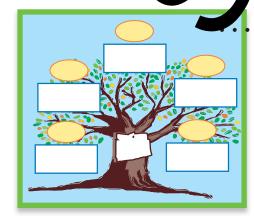
# PERSONAL RESPONSE: WRITING OPINIONS MAKING CONNECTIONS

#### . TREE GRAPHIC ORGANIZER

Like Gloria Dump's ghost tree in shape, this organizer allows students to examine various aspects of the novel. If Opal's name is written on the sign on the trunk, and the names of five other characters are written in the ovals, with one name per oval, the rectangular boxes can serve as a place to describe the relationship Opal has with each character. Similarly, with Opal's name on the tree trunk sign, students can write one of the novel's themes in each oval (i.e., loss, loneliness, abandonment, loving those around you, etc.), and in the rectangular boxes explain how each relates to Opal's life. 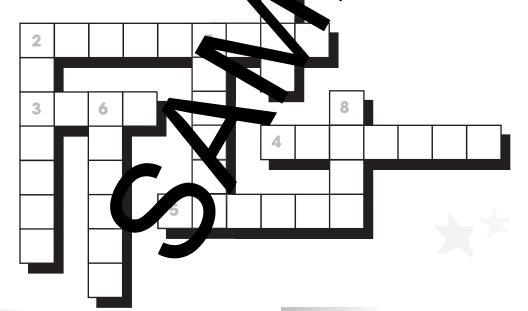
