



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

Change Worksheet 1, Problem 1:

Bobby prepared a lot of meals for his long hike. He ate 42 meals as he hiked through the mountains. There were 15 meals left at the end of his hike. How many meals did he prepare for his hike?



Work

Explanation

First, I figured out that this is a change problem, because it has a beginning, a change, and an ending.

Next, I organized the information on the change diagram.

Then, I decided to add 42 and 15 to figure out the meals he prepared at the beginning, because he should have more meals at the beginning than at the end of the hike.

Finally, I wrote my math sentence and solved it. I also wrote the complete answer with the number and label.

Answer: 57 meals
