STEVE JOBS



The family of four moved to Los Altos, California, near the electronics company, Hewlett Packard.




In high school, Steve met someone who would have a big impact on his life. He met college student Steve Wozniak. Everybody called him Woz.

He snuck into creative classes, such as calligraphy.




He lost his dorm room because he wasn't enrolled in school anymore. He slept on friends' floors.
