

TEACHING SIGN 1

Stop

Show students this *Stop* sign. This is a *Stop* sign. It means to stop and look for cars.

A *Stop* sign tells people to:

- Stop. Make the hand signal for "stop."
- Wait for their turn. Place your hands on your hips and slowly tap one foot three times to indicate "wait."
- Look all ways, and go when it is safe. Turn your head back and forth as if looking all around, and then begin walking forward.



TEACHING SIGN 2

Bike Lane

Show students this *Bike Lane* sign. This is a *Bike Lane* sign. It means that the small lane on the side of the street is for bike riders.

A *Bike Lane* sign tells bike riders to:

Ride inside the bike lane. Pretend to be riding a bike. Then make a "bike lane" by straightening both arms in front of your body.



TEACHING SIGN 3

Playground Ahead

Show students this *Playground Ahead* sign. This is a *Playground Ahead* sign. It tells people that they are close to a playground and need to look for children playing.

A *Playground Ahead* sign tells drivers and bike riders to:

- Slow down. Move your arms as if running, and then move them slower and slower to indicate "slow down."
- Look for children who might run into the street. Place your hand above your eyebrows, and look from left to right. Then point to the children on the front of this sign.
