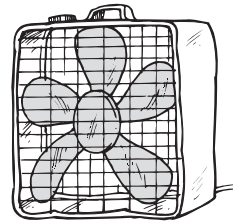

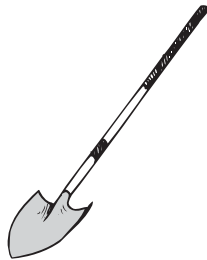

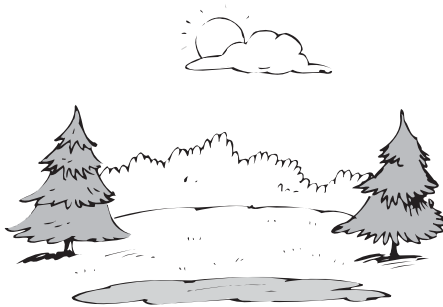
1. Point to the picture that shows what you use to keep you warm.

3. Point to the picture that shows when you use an umbrella.

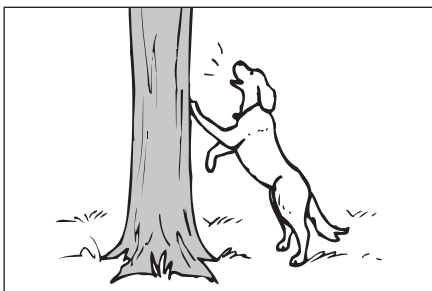
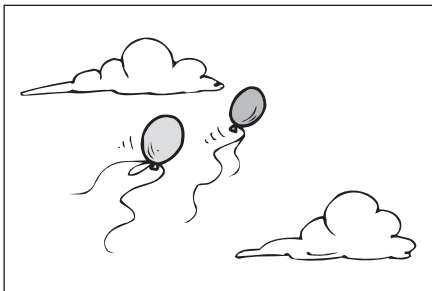

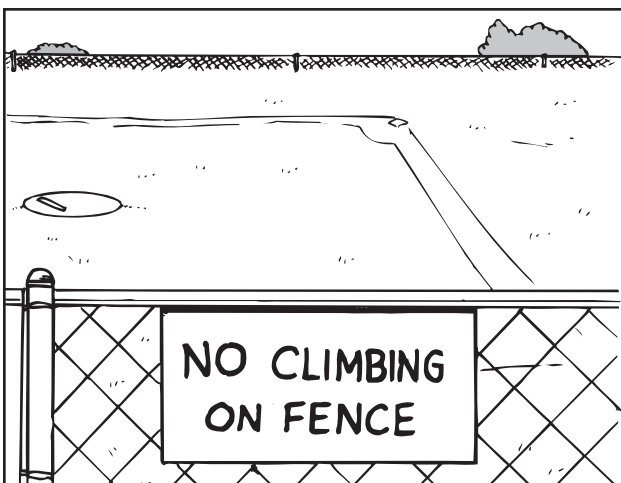
1. Mrs. Taylor has a rule that there is no talking in her classroom. Do you think that's a good rule? Why?



2. One of the rules at the swimming pool is No Running. Do you think this is a good rule? Why?

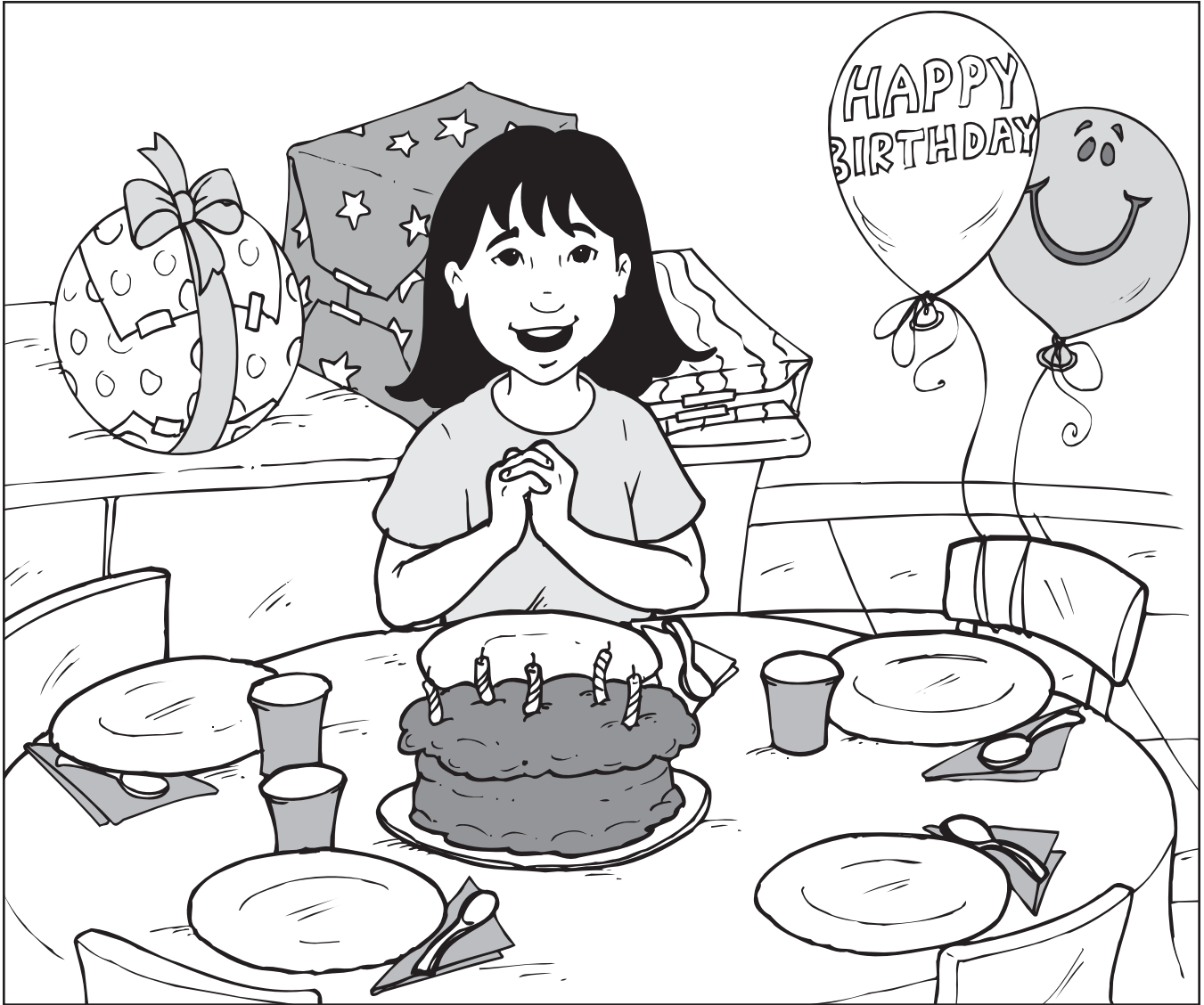


3. At the ballpark, climbing on the fence is not allowed. Do you think this is a good rule? Why?
