
## Was/Were Questions

- 1. Was the drawer full?
- 2. Was the hog muddy?
- 3. Was the girl looking up?
- 4. Was the conductor waving his baton?
- 5. Was the kite higher than the tree?
- 6. Was the flag on the pole torn?
- 7. Were the branches broken?
- 8. Were the oars in the boat?
- 9. Were the keys on a ring?
- 10. Were the steps covered with snow?
- 11. Were the teddy bears bigger than the baby?
- 12. Were the buttons on the coat smaller than a dime?




Modeling Script:

- Look at the pictures at the top of the page. Let's point to the pictures and tell what is happening. The tire was flat.
- Now look at the pictures at the bottom of the page. When you see this big question mark, you start with the question word inside the circle. This word is **was**. [Clinician points to **was** in the sentence and then to **was** inside the question mark.] Take **was** out of the sentence and put it in the question.
- 3. Now let's ask the whole question while we point to each picture. **Was the tire flat?**
- 4. Now let's write the words under each picture. Remember, a written question ends with a question mark.


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Was/Were Questions No-Glamour Question Structure: Interrogative Reversals



## Should/Would/Could Questions


- 1. Should a football player wear shoulder pads?

Modeling Script:


- Look at the pictures at the top of the page. Let's point to the pictures and tell what is happening. I should turn on the computer.
