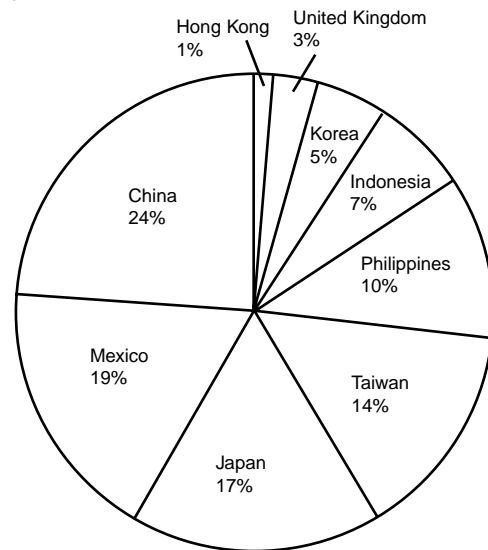

Here are some natural signs that predict rain.



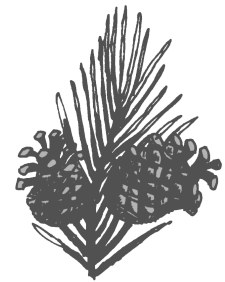
Stones feel moist.
