

In 1620, Pilgrims set out for the New World. They wanted a new way of life with their own rules. They sailed on the *Mayflower*.

There were 44 Pilgrims, called "Saints," and 66 others the Pilgrims called "Strangers." The trip took 65 days. They could only eat cold food because a fire could burn their ship. Many people became sick. One person died before the ship reached land.



The Saints and the Strangers did not get along well. When they saw land, these two groups made an agreement about how they would live in their new home. The agreement was called the "Mayflower Compact." The people named themselves the "Pilgrims."
