1. Why does this boy have an ice pack on his head?

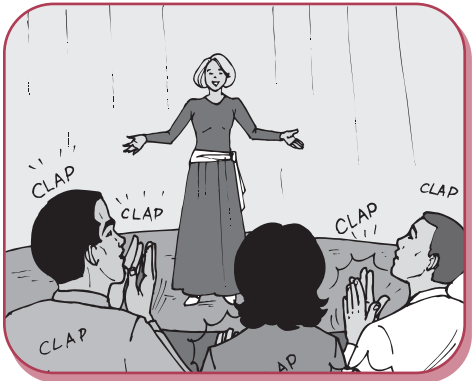

1. What did this boy just open?

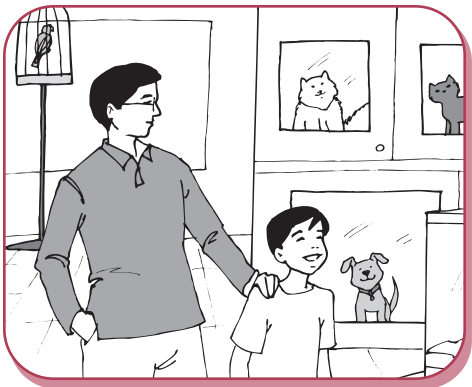
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What might he do next?

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2. What kind of store are these people in?

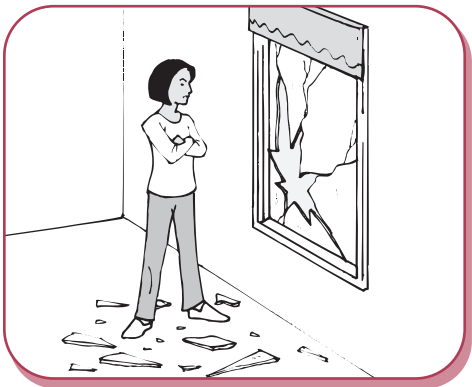
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What might they do next?

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# Inferences From Pantomime

A person's body posture and facial expressions give good clues about what the person is doing or thinking.

➔ Cut these cards apart and use them to play Pantomime. The person who draws the card acts out the words on the card without saying any words. The others guess the words on the card.

I am hungry.	I am tired.	Stay away from me!
I don't know.	I am sad.	I am nervous.
Hurry up!	It's time to go.	Can you hear me?
That's too loud!	I don't have any money.	I am awesome!
Look over there.	I need help.	This is too heavy for me.
I can't hear you.	Come over here.	Don't do that again!
I have an idea!	I can't see very well.	I can't find it.
I'm mad at you.	Please call on me!	Something stinks!
I'm embarrassed.	I'm thirsty.	It's too hot!

# Inferences From Listening

When you hear something, listen for clues about **where** it is happening.

➔ Listen to what I say. Pay attention to clues that tell you **where** something is happening.

1. We bought our tickets and found good seats in a middle row. Mine was on the aisle. We had enough time to buy some popcorn and root beer. Dad saved our seats. We got to our row just before the lights went down.

Where was this happening? **in a (movie) theater**

What clues did you hear? **tickets, seats in a middle row, aisle, popcorn, root beer, row, lights went down**

2. The chickens were waiting for us. They were hungry. As soon as the grain hit the dirt, they gobbled it. After the cows were milked, they walked slowly out of the barn. We brushed Grandpa's horse and gave her some fresh water. Then it was time for breakfast.

Where is this happening? **on a farm**

What clues did you hear? **chickens, cows, barn, horse**

3. We got off the plane quickly, but it is taking a long time to get our suitcases. We have been standing by the belt for about 15 minutes. The buzzer went off a few minutes ago. A few suitcases have gone by, but I haven't seen mine yet.

Where is this happening? **in a baggage claim area in an airport**

What clues did you hear? **off the plane, suitcases, belt, buzzer, suitcases gone by**

4. I'm looking for a book about dinosaurs. I want one with pictures, but I want it to have good information about different kinds of dinosaurs. I need the book to do a report for school. The computer said dinosaur books are in section G on the second floor. This time I brought my card so it should be easy to check it out for a couple of weeks.

Where is this happening? **in a library**

What clues did you hear? **book, computer, section G, card, check (the book) out**
