Implications 1

The word *imply* means to state or do something indirectly or to understand something that hasn't been stated but may have been done. In a story, the author may imply something about the plot or a character without coming right out and saying it. For instance, *Jerry pushed his way through the door ahead of everyone and headed for the cafeteria line*. If you think the author is implying that Jerry was hungry, you're right. There's also another, more important implication: Jerry was rude. We know this because the author used words like *pushed his way* and *ahead of everyone*.
