

“The /h/ sound is very easy to make. Just open your mouth wide and blow the air out your mouth,” explained Twitch.



Clinician’s note: The child may need to hold her nose during initial trials to ensure appropriate production. Once she is able to produce the /h/ sound correctly for 10 consecutive trials with her nose occluded, have her practice the /h/ sound without holding her nose.
