


Killer dinosaurs

These dinosaurs hunted and killed other dinosaurs.









Giant dinosaurs

The biggest dinosaurs that ever lived were plant eaters. These dinosaurs grew so big because they had plenty of food.










The plant-eating dinosaurs died, so the meat-eating dinosaurs died too.

Many insects lived at the time of the dinosaurs. Most were like modern insects, though some were a lot bigger.


A fossil wasp






A modern wasp

"Look at those trees!" said Julie. "They look like trees from millions of years ago!"


"Move!" shouted Terry. "The ring is coming this way!"

A terrible screech came from the sky. Terry and Julie looked up.


Terry gasped.
