


The Nazca lines


The Nazca lines are not a legend—they are real and amazing!

Where are they?

Some people think it is an alien space port. But how would pictures of animals help you land a flying saucer?




This great pyramid was built more than **four** and a half thousand years ago. It is made of around two and a half million heavy blocks of stone.

Somebody worked out that if you tried to build it today, using modern cranes, it would take at least twenty-five years to finish it.

Somehow, the Egyptians managed it in about 23 years!

Bog men

The Shug Monkey runs along roads at night in **Suffolk**, **England**.


What does **shug** mean? It means **deman**. Where's the evidence that it exists? There isn't any.

So why don't they dig it up?


The tomb is said to be a complete city, full of **precious jewels**. There is even a complete map of China, with rivers of **flowing mercury**, a liquid metal.
